

#### Exchequer

While Their Excellencies sat in state, these are the items that I'm recording as being Baronial property. There were other items received of more personal nature, or as largesse, that I did not record as Baronial property.

Kingdom of Northshield: 2 goblets made of Agate from the Black Hills in Northshield

Barony of Andelcrag: 2 complete sets of feast gear (2 plates and bowl [ceramic painted with Ayreton arms], goblet [blue glass], fork/spoon/knife [steel] in each set) and fabric bags to store all of it

Barony of Caer Anterth Mawr: 2 glass goblets

Barony of Carraig Ban: 1 wooden box lined with blue and green felt, 1 herald staff (received a while ago, but noted here)

Barony of Cynnabar: 10 wooden war shield blanks, painted with the Ayreton arms, and a stencil to make more. Barony of Donnerhafen: 1 wooden chest with Ayreton arms on top and beverage cooler section inside, made by the Baron.

Barony of Flaming Gryphon: 1 wooden chest with an arched top

Barony of Illiton: 2 cloaks, made of gold fabric with Baronial arms on the back

Barony of Northwoods: Silk pennant and pole

Barony of Shattered Crystal: 1 fighting pennant (Baronial arms surrounded by gold Midlands serpent)

Barony of Sternfeld: 2 spears with ash shafts and embossed leather covers

Barony of White Waters: Glass box

Shire of Ravenslake: \$200 in golden dollars

Company of the Occupied Otter: 1 double salt cellar (for feast kit)

Master Thomas Pennyngton: 1 marshall staff with Ayreton arms headpiece

I am told that there is a kneeling pillow being made but the embroidery wasn't finished yet so it will be arriving later. I know of no other planned gifts to the Barony.

After all this, I think the only things we lack are a set of 'official' thrones, and maybe a set of fighting tabards to go with the shields. We are certainly well blessed by the generosity of our cousin Baronies and the nearby Kingdom, as well as the other groups that generously gave us gifts!

#### Foxhunt Cbent Report

Foxhunt/Investiture/Rose Tourney was the little event that grew...and grew...and then grew some more. We were excited (also read as scared-to-death) after our initial discussion with Sarafina led to Foxhunt being redesigned as a large event with more Royalty than you could shake a stick at. Not that we would shake sticks at our Royalty. We like them. They made us a BARONY. The event was attended by 439 people, not just our Kingdom but there were also representatives from the Kingdom of Ealdormere and the Kingdom of Northshield.

Obviously, this was much bigger than Foxvale, and rightly so as it was the Barony of Ayreton's Investiture. We, being part of the Barony, luckily had the (then Incipient) Barony ready to step up to the plate and play with us. Not to mention our neighbors from Ravenslake. There was even \$200 golden dollars to place in the baronial coffers from the Shire of Rayenslake.

As the sun was setting, evening court gave way to the feast in the barn. The barn itself looked more like a medieval hall then a barn due to the many banners that decorated the walls. Autumn flowers filled the tables and feast was brought out for the members sitting both high and low feast. Lady Kara outdid herself creating a feast that was delivered under the direction of our servers. The subtleties, while not so subtle...the pig looked like, well, a pig...were indeed delicious. Entertainment was provided, again by many of the talented members of the barony and friends of the barony.

#### Chronicle of the Rose Tourney

The Ayreton Investiture event was a day of beautiful weather, a lovely scenic site, music everywhere, and gorgeous clothes and armor. The hospitality of the Barony and the good organization of the event autocrats were much in evidence throughout the day.

After the Investiture Ceremony, the new Baron Henry and Baroness Nadezda assisted Their Majesties to preside over the Rose Tourney.

There were many clever innovations in this Rose Tourney which added to the wonderful effect. The advance arrangements by the hosting group, the Canton of Foxvale, were outstanding. Lists were beautiful, made new for the occasion with list bannerettes and corner flags. The ground layout of the lists was perfect. The generous spaces between the four lists allowed good visibility from four sides and the Ladies of the Rose were able to stand at the very edge of the lists to accompany their teams closely.

The surrounding pavilions were very scenic, not a modern anachronism in sight! The lunch pavilion was perfectly situated for convenient viewing, and sumptuously outfitted with delicious lunch, charming decorations, and very helpful staff. The lunch pavilion had 3-4 small tables and chairs --rather like a street café with many drop-in visitors.

Considering that this tourney was to honor those who inspire the fighters, it was appropriate that the consorts of the team members were also honored. (After all, they are very likely to be future Ladies of the Rose). The consorts had a refreshment pavilion for themselves, and they also received a souvenir token of a chocolate rosebud. This is the first time that the consorts have been so honored at a Rose Tourney.

When the teams were all chosen, the grand Rose Procession began, with each team being presented to Their Majesties and to the crowd. The procession included excellent flowery speeches during the presentation, and a good amount of poetic boasting about the elegance of the team and honor of the Rose Tourney. Each team was introduced by a flourish of shawms and trombones! (Another innovation which has never been seen before!)

The list field was full of fighters. Sixteen teams took the field, headed by Her Majesty Ceinwen, Duchesses Caitlin, Aislinn, Brigh, Eanor, Rebekah, Kateryn, Elina, AnneMarie, Countesses Fern, Guinievra, Runa, Tessa, and Viscountesses Astrid, Isabella, and Aillieane. Each lady had a team of five: one knight, three unbelted heavy fighters, and one fencer. About half of the team members were chosen during the morning, including most of the fencers.

The format of the tourney was double elimination by teams. This means that each match was five fights, so that each team member fought once in each round. Naturally, the fencers fought each other, and typically the members of the Chivalry fought each other. That left three pairings which could be determined by superior strategy, or by chivalrous speeches, or by other means.

The tourney fights were masterpieces of chivalry, skill, and diplomacy. The Ladies of the Rose very much enjoyed their position as "team captains" and they took an active part in every aspect of the tourney rounds. There was even a little bit of good-natured "trash talk", as the Ladies bragged about their chosen teams! After a number of excellent fights, and some good tension, Duchess Aislinn's team carried the day.

The Ladies of the Rose also supported an Arts competition at this Rose Tourney, another innovation. Each Lady of the Rose was entitled to sponsor two entrants, one Laurel and one member of the populace. The contest entries followed the theme of "A Representation of Chivalry in Any Medium". The various entries were very impressive, including entries in glass, woodworking, and performances of music and storytelling. The winner was the storytelling by Lady Zsof. The logic of the judgment was unexpected: Duke Sir Finvarr de Taahe was the judge, and his extensive reading in medieval history gave him the 16th century definition of chivalry as a situation in which somebody dies. The winning entry therefore, was a story about a battle in which the enemy died.

For the Ladies of the Rose, it was one of the best Rose tourneys ever. Thank you so much to the members of the Barony of Ayreton, who were responsible for this magical event.

I would like to thank the Barony for your outstanding efforts hosting the Rose Tourney in conjunction with your Baronial Investiture.

It was incredibly gracious of you to agree to host the Rose Tourney, especially since you had something so near and dear to your hearts already planned for the day. Few would willingly share their spotlight with another high-profile group and to do so was an unparalleled act of Largesse.

Having attended all of our Rose Tournaments as well as many hosted by other Kingdoms has provided me with a large frame of reference with which to make comparisons. I have to say that by FAR you were head & shoulders above the norm. Y'all sure know how to throw a party!

While I have come to expect a certain level of attention to amenities, NEVER have I been so impressed by absolutely EVERY facet of an event, and I'm truly at a loss to say what impressed me the most. As the day progressed and different activities unfolded, every time I turned around I encountered something that had been done differently by your Barony than has been done by anybody else, and just when I thought it couldn't get any better, it DID!

However, I'd like to start off by saying that I was made to feel more special as a member of the "Old Dead Queen's Club" than I was at many of the events I attended when I served as Crown. Its more or less obligatory to accommodate the Crown, but you went out of your way to make me, a nobody, feel like a very special somebody, and for that you have my gratitude.

So how did I love this Tournament? Let me count the ways:

Let's start off with the most direct route to my heart.... my stomach!! Thus, my first segment of praise is for the Luncheons, which were as much of a feast for the eye as they were for the palate. Everything was so beautifully presented, tasty, and appropriate to the warm summer weather. As a Lady of the Rose I was honored, touched and humbled to be both the subject & recipient of such an outstanding piece of work. It brought tears to my eyes. On an advanced level as a one-time professional musician (York Philharmonic Orchestra) and a student of both modern (Royal Conservatory Of Music) and medieval music (University of Toronto, Faculty of Music) I was able to appreciate it for its complex harmonies and construction.
