Ask Mistress Sarafina

An advice column for those in need

Dear Mistress Sarafina, I hear that you have recently returned from a trip across the pond and encountered many interesting and historical things. Can you share a thing you learned that would be helpful to your reenactor friends?

Greetings and well met.

You heard correctly! I did just return from a trip to Europe. I visited England, France, The Netherlands, Denmark, and Belgium!

Something very exciting has been discovered regarding the crew of the Mary Rose. For those who don't know, the Mary Rose was Henry VIII's ship that sank in 1545. It sits in drydock at a museum dedicated to its preservation and study in Portsmouth, England. I spent nearly an entire day looking at all the amazing finds. I was also privileged to be able to meet with Sally Tyrell, who is the Head of Development for the museum. By happy coincidence, the day that I visited the museum was the day that they launched an addition to the exhibit detailing how two of the eight skeletons that they've found show African heritage. Although it has been known that people of African heritage lived in Europe during the SCA time period, due to the extensive whitewashing of history, many people still remain ignorant of the fact that not only were there black people living in England, but that they were NOT slaves and several folks had positions of honor.

I was thrilled beyond belief to be able to view this exhibit and be this close to objects from my SCA time period in real life. The Mary Rose Museum is definitely a place I plan to visit again as soon as possible!

Ayretonian Pastimes

This new column features an interview with a Barony member who is Doing Something Cool. Our first victim....errr... interviewee is THL Alexander Adelbrecht von Markelingen

Can you briefly describe the process of etching?



The process begins by cleaning, with soap and water, and lightly scuffing the surface of the metal you are etching with some fine steel wool. This will allow the designs to adhere to the surface of the metal better.

You then apply a resist to the metal, much like resists in other mediums, this resist it so prevent the etching solution, from contacting the metal on those surface areas.

Your resist can be any number of things, so long as it adheres to the metal. You can use cut adhesive vinyl, nail polish, or permanent marker. I use toner from my laser printer, transferred using a heat transfer process from specialty paper. Making sure to cover the back of your piece, I use duct tape to get a good cover that doesn't let the solution touch the back. Anywhere the solution touches will be etched. Once it is etched, it can't be un-etched.

For etching solution, I am using ferric chloride, as I am etching brass. This will also

work for copper, a key part of brass, and nickel silver as I understand, but have not yet tried, on account of the high cost of nickel, but I am excited to play with it soon as a method of creating white metal pieces, perfect for things like the Silver Oak, or many Ayreton Heraldic Pieces.

Placing the metal face down in the etching solution, you leave it for 30-60 minutes at a time to do it's work, depending on how deep you want to etch into the metal, and how thick your metal is, you can have it etching for upwards of 4 hours, but still check regularly, and agitate the solution to ensure an even etch.

Once you are satisfied, you move the piece to a bath of water and baking soda to neutralize the etching solution. DO NOT let the baking soda, or any of the mix get into the etching solution, it will ruin it, in spectacular fashion. Think Science Fair Volcano!

From there it is all about cleaning the piece, cutting the final shape, filing and sanding to the desired finish. You can paint the etched sections, or leave them plain, your choice.



What drew you to this art form?

I don't have much talent for hand carving molds for pewter casting, really hand drawing is not a strong suit of mine, and I lack the appropriate space to really do things like sand casting. I tried my hand at casting in pewter, but it just wasn't something I was enjoying as much, there are too many things that can go wrong and cause bad casts. I lack the patience to press through that. I do however have a decent ability to create graphic art on the computer and that works well here. Several years back I was looking at my feed on Facebook and I saw a shared post of the work of Her Ladyship Gæira Aggadóttir (Gear-Ra), from the East Kingdom. She was etching brass and I loved the look. It sparked the interest, but I didn't really know where to go from there. About a year or two ago I met Viscount Antonii Machinevik, we became Facebook friends and then I saw him

posting his etching work. I was again floored. I reached out for information this time. I wanted to know how he did it. So about a year ago I started to collect the supplies to start.

How did you learn to do it?

I can credit Viscount Antonii for his guidance. He gave me a fairly start to finish, well written explanation, I supplemented that with a few months of YouTube and Google searching. The day I first set up to do the work, I was in constant contact with His Excellency for pointers, troubleshooting and support. I am still learning, for example, things like temperatures affect how long the etching takes, warmer temps work faster than colder temps.

What's the best thing about the work?

The best thing, my favorite thing, is seeing the work come to life, going from a sheet of metal, to an intricately detailed design. And the possibilities for using it are pretty wide, I can create belt plaques and medallions, or if I wanted, armor fittings. The technique can be applied to coronets and circlets as well. When I finish a piece, it gives me a real sense of accomplishment.
