## A Report on our All Souls Visitors By Evzenie

Students in the Elmhurst College First Year Seminar class ("Member, Fan, Groupie, Cultist") were participant-observers at Vanished Wood's All Souls event in November. The class studies the social psychology about why people participate in various group activities, from hobby groups to cults. Their instructor has them do some field research at the All Souls event, ie, interview people and participate in activities. The SCA is a particularly good venue for the kind of thing he wants them to do, as our base "rule" for participation is wearing garb, which puts them automatically (at least a little) in the role of participant-observer.

The students write journal entries after their day with us, and I wanted to share some of the things they said about their experience. Some of their observations are sweet, some are funny, some are pointed in that way that college students can be. I'm reporting them anonymously, and although they also took pictures I haven't obtained their permission to use them, but I'd be happy to show people in person--so if you talked to one the students and would like to see the selfies they took with you I'd be happy to share.

Here are some of their observations:

❖ "I learned a lot at the SCA event. Everyone I saw seemed very friendly and very open to talk. Majority of the people at this event have been involved with the SCA for a long time. Each member has a specific role in the program. Some are merchants, some are fighters, and some are considered royalty. It seemed to me that the members were like a big happy family. They mainly do it for themselves and to have a good time. Dressing in costume and reliving past times is fun for the people in SCA."

❖ "Being a part of this experience helped open to my eyes to what sorts of societies are like and to see what being a part of this type of group is like. After this meeting, we went over to see what the fighting was like and hit a dummy. This part was interesting because it helped me understand what all the different types of fighting were like back in those times."

❖ "I think that this event was a great one to go to for our class because it was cool to immerse ourselves."

❖ "It was fun to dress up and become a part of the scene in SCA. all of the people were very nice and happy to talk to you. My favorite part was finger weaving the bracelet. I love learning new things and I love making crafts, so it was fun to learn how to finger weave. What I learned was a basic pattern and I would probably go back and learn more patterns."

❖ "My first thought when I entered the event was "Why are all those old people dressed up in these weird outfits?", but as I began to talk to others I started to understand why they liked participating as a group so much."

❖ "The SCA is a group of people who are fascinated by the renaissance of European culture, without all of the murder and sexism involved in the deep history between 6th and 16th century Europe."

❖ "I also noticed they take it very seriously and talk as if they were living in that time. I know that is probably how it should be but I found it a little amusing. I overheard one woman say she found the knights to be stuck up and it was funny because you don't hear those sentences everyday."

❖ "Being in the SCA is a form of experiential learning that most students will never get in the classroom. Even college students do not get this much hands on learning experience and she thinks that is key for young minds."

❖ "Another characteristic they share is that they are all very accepting of each other. They do not care where you come from, what interests you have or how you look."

❖ "There was a fencing tournament and that was really cool to watch. They wore protection so they did not get hurt. There was so much technique involved when fighting with swords. You have to go through training before you can fight in tournaments which can take about three months to complete. The fighting was definitely my favorite part of the event."

Once again I'd like to thank the event staff and members of the Barony who helped make this a good experiential learning activity for the students. I have hopes that one of these times we will get a couple of them interested enough to come back.
