A Medieval Miscellany

Bluetooth & Handguns: Is There a Connection?

A lot of people have heard of Harald Bluetooth, who reigned over Denmark and, briefly, Norway in the tenth century. But not many know that he's the inspiration for the technology called Bluetooth—as well as its trademark.

Who was Harald, anyway? Born Harald Gormsson, the son of King Gorm, he ruled over Denmark from 958 to 986—a heck of a long time for the era. His nickname of “Bluetooth” probably came from a conspicuous bad tooth; the Old Norse word “blar” can be translated as either “blue” or “black.” He was a Christian convert, but that didn't stop him from expanding the Danish kingdom. From roughly 970 to 985 A.D. (as usual with this time period, dates are approximate) he also ruled Norway, after the assassination of the Norse king. (Convenient!) Probably because of that, he's not a shining star in the Norse Sagas. But he is given credit for converting Denmark to Christianity—such as it was in that warlike time!

Jim Kardach, an Intel engineer working on wireless technology, was reading a book about Harald when he, like many in the field during the '90's, was trying to build a way to unite the different wireless platforms that were springing up. He noted that Harald was the first to unite the Scandinavian countries of Denmark and Norway, even if only briefly. Kardach called the results of his tech effort

“Bluetooth,” after the Danish king who so interested him.

The blue logo for Bluetooth is actually a combination of the futhark runes initials of Harald Bluetooth.

As for Guns:

One of the more documented women's names at this time was Gunnhild, or Gunhilda, or Gunnhildr, and is in fact the name of two well-known queens of Scandinavian origin. The name comes from the Old Norse words *gunne* (war) and *hildr* (battle). The earlier Gunnhild is notorious in the Sagas as a witch and a poisoner—but given that few women had any political power in that era, one can take this with a grain of salt... The wife of King Eirik of Norway—possibly the same Eirik as “Eric Bloodaxe,” who conquered the kingdom of Jorvik (York) in Northumbria in Britain—she has been identified as the sister of Harald Bluetooth. She and Eirik were overthrown and exiled, but after her husband's death, she returned to Norway when her sons were able to regain the throne. Her son Harald Greyhide (or Greycloak) became king, and during his reign was politically active, dominating the court, but Harald was assassinated, probably with the connivance of his uncle, who ruled Norway for four or five years (see above). She was eventually killed, probably around 980, at the order of Harald Bluetooth, probably for supporting her other sons' raids on the territory.

Incidentally, Harald Bluetooth's wife was also named Gunnhild.

The other Queen Gunhilda or Gunnhild was actually the daughter of King Cnut and Emma of Normandy; her half-brothers included kings Harald Harefoot, Harthacnut, and Edward (the Confessor). She actually the granddaughter of Harald Bluetooth.

She was married to the heir to the Holy Roman Empire but died before he inherited the throne. While less spectacular than her namesake, she still had some political clout, during an age when women were almost invisible.

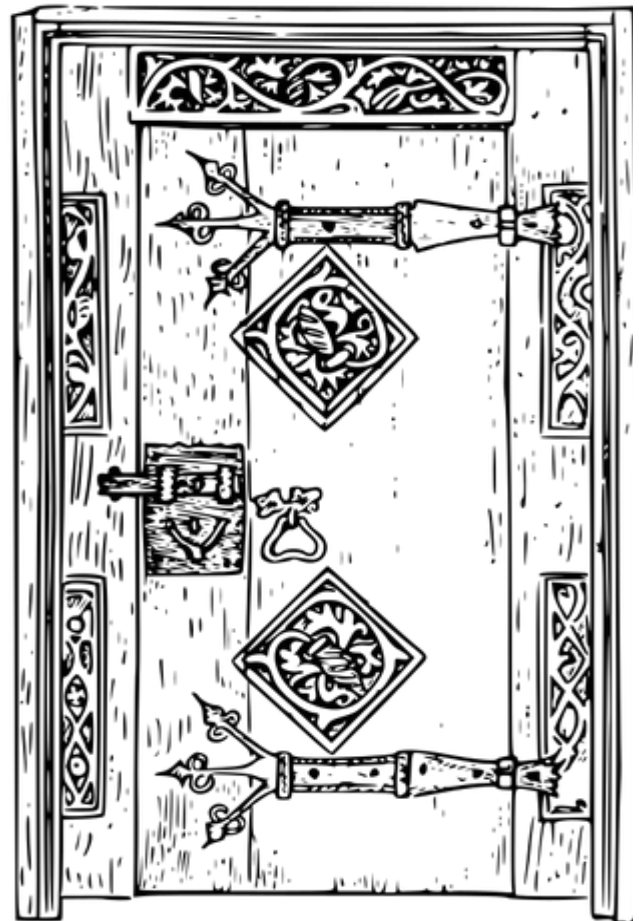
So, what do they have to do with anything? Well, in the 1300's, a large ballista was set up at Windsor Castle (a ballista being a sort of catapult that threw bolts like a crossbow, for us non-military types). The soldiers named it "Domina Gunilda," or "Lady Gunhilda." They may have named it after one of the famous queens, or just because the name translates to "war battle." (Hm. Does that mean Gunnhilda was the first old battleaxe?)

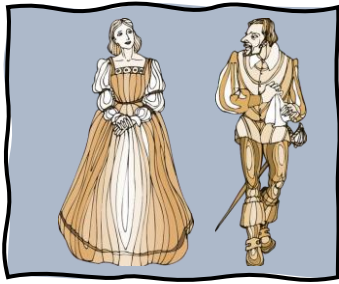
Eventually, the name just got shorted to "Queen Gunna," and then when gunpowder was introduced in Europe, smaller, handheld cannons were called "hand-gunnas" – or handguns.

So, if we go with the hypothesis that the ballista at Windsor was named after one of the two most famous Queen Gunnhild (or Gunhilda, or Gunnhildr...), then we have a connection to Harald Bluetooth. The first was probably his sister; the second his granddaughter.
