Greetings from our Baron and Baroness



Greetings Ayreton,

We would like to say a hearty Welcome Back, with the understanding that times are still tumultuous, and no one should feel as if they are expected to be at an event, practice or meeting if they are not comfortable doing so.

When at events and SCA gatherings please continue to follow the COVID guidelines as put into place by SCA, Inc and the Middle Kingdom. This includes ensuring that proof of vaccination along with an ID, or negative COVID test, and a maske worn indoors is implemented.

There are new guidelines recently added that allow food to be served at SCA events.

Tier 3 requirements are as follows:

Effective immediately (Tier 3 food service rules) The intent of these rules is to allow people to gather for food whilst minimizing the length of time numbers of people without masks are congregated together in an indoor setting. Please honor the spirit of these rules.

No individual is required to eat in a group setting including Baronage and Royalty,

This policy does not supersede the current requirement to remain masked indoors at all times except whilst eating or drinking. Remain masked whilst moving around, preparing food, collecting food, serving food, or waiting for food and talking.

- Certain activities, including singing, have been shown to generate an unusually high number of infectious particles. **Therefore, at this time we cannot allow vocal performance in a space with unmasked individuals due to the high risk of transmission.**
- Fighters should be self-reliant and have water, or a refillable water bottle. The list may provide water at the discretion of the KEM.
- No individual is required to eat in a group setting including Baronage and Royalty.
- Individuals may provide food for their own purposes at their own risk.
- Arrangement of tables for food service. If tables are to be provided, they should be spaced 6ft apart with signs stating: "Please limit occupancy of this table to a single infection pod; sit with your group, not others. You may remove your mask while actively eating or drinking but are expected to put it back on once completed".

- Lunch – serve food in such a manner that minimizes the standing of people in line. Food does not have to be individually wrapped. Prepare and individually dish out items with gloved hands or service ware. Have items readily available for pick up and return to individual day camps/tables.
- Potlucks – Guests should be invited to the potluck table one table at a time and should remain masked whilst selecting food. Serving spoons and/or gloves should be available to those dining.
- Tavern style dinners- Guests should be invited to the tavern one table at a time to pick up food for a single table/feaster and should remain masked whilst collecting food. Serving spoons and/or gloves should be available to feasters. Please note that a tavern style feast is a few dishes at most two courses. This is not an extended 2–3-hour 3+ course feast.
- With these changes, we anticipate the return of camaraderie and the sharing of the food and cheer (at your own risk).

Tier 2 will be a return to normal with no restrictions.

With these new guidelines in place, we can take one step closer towards enjoying each other’s companionship even more. We will say it has been wonderful to see some of you live and in person, and we have been grateful for the assistance you are giving to other groups within the Midrealm.

As we continue to move forward if there is a meeting, a gathering, or an activity you would like to see us at, please ask. We, like everyone, are trying to relearn where and when activities are happening.

We also commend those who are keeping virtual activities going in order to reach out to those who don’t have as much freedom of movement.

On a personal note, we would like to say thank you for everyone’s support during Dad’s illness. He remembered all of you singing Happy Birthday, led by the Pippins, a few 12th Nights ago. During one of our last talks, he stated he was grateful that we have friends and people in our lives who are there for us in so many ways. Ayreton, you are in our hearts and we will be forever grateful

A Medieval Miscellany

Picts or It Didn't Happen – Part III

The story of Scotland and the Picts is a long and complex one; the articles I've posted barely scratch the surface. They don't tell of the endless warfare between the Picts, the Romans, Northumbria, Strathclyde, Dal Riada, the Vikings, the Normans and even the Orkneys. They don't tell of the Pictish contributions to the Scottish language—in fact, we know little of that, since there are few remnants of their language left. They don't tell of the Pictish culture—what little we know of it. Much of what we know of Pictland, Pictavia, or Fortriu is hearsay, or through documents written centuries after the events which they describe.

A few things are certain, though. The Picts resisted Roman rule far more successfully than the other Celtic tribes of Britain. Only the Welsh and to a lesser extent, the Cornish, were able to keep Roman occupation to a minimum. The rest of the island was thoroughly pacified by the time the Romans withdrew, leaving it vulnerable to the later incursions by the Angles, Saxons, and Jutes. Despite the efforts of the Deirans, later the Northumbrians, much of Pictland remained unanglicized, its inhabitants known throughout Britain for their ferocity. Even the Dal Riadan Scoti, who later gave their name to Scotland, were fought to a standstill, only eventually merging with the Picts on more or less equal terms.

So why do I say, "Picts or it didn't happen"? Well, Scotland wouldn't be the same if it weren't for the Picts. Resisting the Romans kept them edgy enough to fight off later invaders. If the Romans had succeeded in conquering and pacifying them, the later Scoti and Anglo-Saxons would have found them easier to subdue. The history of Scotland would be that of the Dal Riada facing off against the Northumbrians, and would probably have ended up much like Wales and England, an uneasy border between them. Moreover, like Welsh and English, the language of the North would be divided between

Irish and English, without the influence of the native Pictish language to differentiate Scots Gaelic from Irish.

After the Vikings, eastern Scotland would be part of the Danelaw, and the language would begin to reflect Scandinavian influences, just as northern English did. The people there would sound more like Yorkshiremen than Scots. Would the western Scots be able to counter the Vikings—or would they, too, become part of the Danelaw? Without the strength of the Picts, they might have.

On a tangent—did you know that the term "English" didn't come from the country name of "England"? In fact, people were referring to the Anglo-Saxons as the English long before they began to call the country "Angle-Land." The people were Mercian or Kentish or Anglian, but the language they all spoke was "Angle-ish" – or English. It wasn't until the 900's, when the slow unification of the country began, that people started speaking of "Angle-Land."

Anyway, my contention is that the obstinacy and ferocity of the Picts went a long way to birthing the country we know as Scotland, and without them, the country would be a different place.

What drew you to the SCA?




A bit about your life outside of the SCA? Job? Hobbies?

Announcing the Great Book of Ayreton

Greetings unto all,

Sometime back, Their Excellencies talked of the possibility of a community project. The idea was to have a document that would act as a repository for the history of the Barony, as well as a way to display the talents of its many artists. In short, the creation of a Great Book for Ayreton. (For those who aren't familiar with a Great Book, the following Middleniki link goes to the Middle Kingdom Great Book. http://middleniki.midrealm.org/index.php/Great_book)

With the permission of Their Excellencies, I am acting as the coordinator for this effort. I spoke on this topic at the August Baronial meeting, explaining the basics of the project, and requesting feedback, suggestions, and volunteers.

The idea behind the Great Book is it's about the history and culture of our Barony. Possible content could include:

- A History of the Founding of the Barony of Ayreton.
- History of major events within our borders.
- Lists of officers, champions, etc.
- Songs and poems about the Barony.
- History of each of the cantons.
- Display of the awards of the Barony.

So, how can someone help? There are a number of roles for interested participants.

Historians. Do you have information about the founding of the Barony? Can you write about your canton? What about those who held positions, such as the Mayor of the proto-Barony? It's important to remember that Ayreton's history does not start with the founding of the Barony.

Bards and Poets. This goes along with Historian, but also includes poetry and songs written about the Barony.

Editors. Volunteers are needed to review and edit submitted text, prior to someone inscribing the calligraphed page. All content should follow the SCA governing documents. The final arbiters for any editorial decisions include myself, and the Baron & Baroness.

Calligraphers and Illuminators. Since this is a book, there are a lot of opportunities on this front. Art styles are fairly wide open. Contact me for technical specifications, such as paper type, size, etc. No one is expected to do an entire page by themselves. If you enjoy illumination, but don't do much calligraphy, partner with someone who does. I can assist with finding someone.

Artisans. Calligraphy and illumination will take a leading role at the beginning, but as the Great Book progresses, other skills will be needed. Bookbinding is one obvious possibility, but others, such as metal, leather or wood working could be needed, to form the binding or a travel case.

Other roles. To be determined as needed.
