A Medieval Miscellany

St. Patrick: International Man of Mystery

To be honest, I was planning a different topic for this month's column, but I realized it would be coming out in March, and let's face it—March is all about St. Patrick. At least in the US, it's a time for the Wearin' of the Green, dyeing rivers green, painting faces green, and getting wasted on green beer and throwing up green. And wearing those stupid headbands with the shamrock antennae. No saint in the calendar has such a following except maybe St. Nicholas in his Santa Claus guise.

Everyone knows the myths: he drove the snakes out of Ireland, he invented the four-leafed clover (really, people?), he single-handedly converted the Irish to Christianity, and he was Irish, right?

Um, no.

First, the climate of Ireland is exactly the wrong kind for snakes. Snakes like the heat, particularly venomous snakes, which you'll usually find in either warm wet climates or warm dry climates. The operative word there is "warm." Ireland's temperature rarely gets much above 60 degrees Fahrenheit. It's wet and cold. (It's on the same latitude as Newfoundland.) Even copperheads and water moccasins (native to the New World, btw), which live in more temperate climates, hibernate during the winter, and come out in the heat of the summer. Reptiles are cold-blooded creatures, and cold only makes them sluggish.

There is no evidence that there ever were snakes in Ireland, at least not since people settled there.

One of the most well-known stories about Patrick is how he taught about the Trinity using a shamrock (three leaves, one for each of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit). He didn't use a four-leafed one. It's not even the same plant.

There were Christian communities in Ireland by the time Patrick returned; in fact, there were a number of

Christian missionaries and bishops there from the mid fourth century on.

And he was definitely **not** Irish. He was born somewhere in Britain, sometime around 385. He never called himself "Patrick" – or even "Padraig," the Irish version of his name. He only referred to himself as "Patricius." A Roman name because he was the son of a Roman decurion and deacon. Historians aren't sure where exactly he was from, but he himself said he was from a prominent Romano-British family. There is no doubt he was educated. But at the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and sold into slavery.

According to his own *Declarations*, one of the two surviving manuscripts we're pretty sure he wrote, he wasn't even particularly religious as a kid. But he spent six years in Ireland as a shepherd; the isolation gave him the time to figure out what he thought and what he believed. He says he heard a voice telling him it was time to go home and that a ship was waiting for him, so he abandoned his flock (one hopes only metaphorically) and headed for the coast, where he talked his way aboard a ship bound for Britain.

Thereafter he suffered shipwreck with the rest of the crew, and had many adventures, which we can believe or not as we choose. There seems to be some doubt as to the authenticity of his tales; they may have originally been meant as parables. Finally, he was reunited with his family.

He only stayed a few years there, however; soon he traveled to Gaul and studied at a number of monasteries, finally returning to Ireland, where he went about his religious work.

It is believed that he died around 460 AD, in Ireland. The date of his death is observed as March 17th, although we have no way of knowing for sure.

Incidentally—he has never been canonized by the Catholic Church. In the early Middle Ages, canonization was handled at the diocesan level, not by the Pope. And when the duty devolved onto the Pope, many of the old saints got lost in the shuffle.

Chronicler's Note: My Dear Librarian Alexandria and others, historical accuracy aside, Pádraig is the Irish for Patrick and he is the Patron Saint of Ireland, much like Saint Jadwiga (Andrew) is the Patron Saint of Poland, Saint Nikolaos (Nicholas) is the Patron Saint of Greece, St. Dafydd – or Dewi Sant – is the Patron Saint of Wales. So even though St. Patrick's name was Patricius, when talking about the Irish holiday of St. Patrick's Day, NEVER refer to it as St. Patty's Day! It's St. Patrick or St. Paddy but not St. Patty. ---Signed, a fervent person of Irish descent
