A Medieval Miscellany

Horsing Around

Part I – Battle Horses

Popular culture has given us a picture of a medieval knight in shining armor, clad in plate from head to pointy toe, perched astride an enormous destrier, sword in hand. Popular culture is nuts.

Okay, the term “destrier” is acceptable, and it was, in fact, one of the types of horses used in medieval times. And yes, the knights – and the horses – did wear plate armor, at least late in the Middle Ages when feudalism was in full swing, and they could afford it. But the full suits of armor and the great horses really belonged to the Renaissance, and mostly in tournaments, not in warfare. Today’s Shires, Percherons, and Clydesdales are impressive beasts, but they aren’t the same animals that carried Sir Jo d’Schmo into battle.

While the average height of a man wasn’t that much smaller than today (5’7” then versus 5’9” to 5’10” now) the horses that those men (and a few women) rode were considerably smaller than the giant mounts that we imagine when we think of knights. The rationale behind the “great horse” image is that of course, a horse had to be huge to carry a man in full plate armor. But they really don’t. For one thing, full suit of armor (which only the wealthiest could afford; most armor was bits and pieces) is usually less than 90 pounds—it had to be light enough for a man to wear it, for hours on end. If a man can carry a suit of armor, an average horse could easily carry both. Medieval war horses were generally about 14.5 to 16 hands at the withers (a hand is 4 inches, so roughly 4’8” to 5’5”). A modern pony is classified as being 14.2 hands or less.

For another thing, riding a giant animal into battle sounds impressive, but what happens when you get knocked off in the heat of battle? Getting back on a great horse that’s more than 5 foot high, moving, and fired up with fighting (well-trained horses were weapons in their own right) would be

impossible—assuming your opponents gave you enough time to actually do it.

In general, mounted cavalry would be used for the initial attack, breaking the enemy’s lines to permit the infantry to move in. They would be armed more with lances than swords, which would throw the weight of the knight and horse and the power of the forward momentum into the point to make it even deadlier as a weapon. Swords were generally used for foot battle; either after the knight was unhorsed or after he dismounted to fight on foot, which was not uncommon. It wasn’t till the heyday of tournaments that larger horses began to be used, and even then, they weren’t all that large.

Tournaments originated in the eleventh century as training sessions for knights (chevaliers in France, caballeros in Spain, cavalieri in Italy, all of which mean “horsemen.” “Knight” comes from an Old English word meaning “boy.” Go figure. And yes, the “k” was pronounced: “k-nicht.” But not “k-niggit,” sorry). They gradually became more of an entertainment spectacle, drawing audiences ranging from the poorest of the poor to the highest lords and ladies of the land. (I’m reminded of the scene in “A Knight’s Tale” where Rufus Sewell is poring over the tournament results much as fans do football scores.) Part of the appeal might have been the fact that people often died as a result of injuries in the tournaments—medieval man was a bloodthirsty beast...
